THE SCHOOL

Founded in 1432, Sevenoaks enjoys a global reputation as a centre of academic excellence and a flagship school for the International Baccalaureate. A co-educational day and boarding school, it offers a stimulating, intellectually demanding and balanced education for over 1200 students from ages 11 to 18.

Sevenoaks is one of the world's leading IB schools, having taught the International Baccalaureate for over 40 years. For nearly 20 years, all Sixth Form students have taken the full IB Diploma with consistently outstanding academic results which are testament to the school's experience and commitment to the programme.

Sevenoaks is the top large-cohort IB school in the UK and among the top five globally. In recent years it has been the second highest achieving large-cohort IB school in the world. Sevenoaks is also the top fully co-ed all-IB boarding school in the UK, according to Best Schools (Education Advisers Ltd). The Sunday Times named Sevenoaks School Co-educational Independent Secondary School of the Year in 2023.

The school is one of the largest employers in the local area, employing staff in a wide variety of roles, and aiming to be an employer of choice for top staff from around the world. We offer our staff a competitive range of benefits and are in the process of developing a range of progressive employment policies and opportunities for personal and professional development All Sevenoaks staff are encouraged to enjoy facilities such as our sports centre and pool, attend

performances at our performing arts centre, and get involved in service activities within the local community. We strive to promote the positive mental and physical health of all staff, and are committed to ensuring that equality, diversity and inclusion are at the very heart of our culture and community. We believe every member of the school community should feel welcomed, included and valued.

THE CAMPUS

The school is situated in the Kent market town of Sevenoaks and has a prime position at the top of the high street. The 100-acre site, which includes several listed buildings and attractive gardens, is beautifully landscaped and adjoins the medieval deer park of Knole. London is only a 30-minute train ride away and the school is in commutable distance from several Kent towns including Orpington, Tonbridge, Tunbridge Wells, Bromley, Kings Hill and Dartford.

Recent developments on campus include a superb sports centre, a state-of-the-art performing arts centre, a world-class Science and Technology Centre and a Global Study Centre for the Sixth Form. Our campus has earned several architectural awards, including two RIBA National Awards (2019, 2022).

With eight distinctive and comfortable boarding houses, our boarding community is fun, friendly and busy.



SUMMER PROGRAMMES

Sevenoaks School Summer Programmes are twoweek academic enrichment courses for ambitious international students aged 11-16. Students

can choose either The Summer Programme, our English Language Course or the Music Programme. The Summer Programme includes four ten-hour modules on Critical Thinking, Social Leadership, Creativity and Digital Skills. These modules are all integral to the academic life of any Sevenoaks pupil, so international students will leave The Summer Programme with a real indication of Sevenoaks School academics. The English Language Course is aimed at students looking to improve their English during the summer holidays. The Music Programme is designed to teach musicians the skills sought after in UK music scholars.

The sessions run for 2 x 2 week periods, however applicants can apply to work for either 2 weeks or 4 weeks:

Session One: Wednesday 2 – Wednesday 16 July 2025.

Session Two: Thursday 17 - Thursday 31 July 2025. Compulsory training days and set up will take place on 30 June and 1 July 2025.

THE ROLE

Activity Leaders will lead groups of students and help supervise multiple activities, both sporting and creative. They will also be responsible for supervising students on excursions and evening social activities. Activity Leaders may also be required to assist with student arrivals and departures, accompanying students to and from airports. The position is offered as a casual contract. Although applicants who have full availability throughout this period may be prioritised, applicants who can only work one session will also be considered.

RESPONSIBILITIES AND MAIN DUTIES

This job description is not intended to be a comprehensive statement of procedures and responsibilities, but instead sets out the principal expectations of the school in relation to the post holder's professional responsibilities and duties. We are looking for individuals who are adaptable, flexible and willing to carry out a wide range of duties required to make a success of this role.

- Attend compulsory training days on 30 June and 1 July.
- Attend our First Aid course on 27 June if not already qualified.
- Provide a competent and professional meet and greet service at airports for arrival and departure days in a warm, positive and flexible manner.
- Orientate and help new students as required.
- Prepare and lead activities, producing session plans for each activity.
- Provide coaching to an appropriate level in any specialised field in which the Activity Leader is suitably qualified (be it sport or the arts).



- Read and understand the risk assessment for each activity/excursion to ensure student safety at all times.
- Accompany and supervise groups of students on excursions, ensuring student enjoyment and wellbeing.
- Engage and integrate the Sevenoaks students and International students throughout the cocurricular programme.
- Be aware of, monitor and manage student conduct and behaviour to promote a harmonious international community to ensure students enjoy and get the most out of each activity/excursion.
- Plan and supervise an exciting and varied evening activity programme.
- Plan activities for and assist with welcomes on arrival day and the student induction and team building activities on the arrival evenings.
- Complete attendance registers for each activity.
- Attend daily team meetings and additional activity and excursion briefings where necessary.
- Actively manage, supervise and engage with students during meal times in order to ensure a calm and pleasant dining experience for all.
- Carry out the duties and responsibilities of the post in accordance with the School's relevant policies including Code of Conduct and Health and Safety.
- Ensure that all services within the areas of responsibility are provided in accordance with the School's commitment to high quality

service provision.

HOURS

The Activity Leader will be required to work 6 days per week (except excursion days which are 08:00 – 19:00.)
